## CLUES GET-TOGETHER


To acknowledge and appreciate the school Clubs for their work throughout the year, we at Holy Name High School organized a gettogether.




# CELEBRAY ON OR OF NATURE






The school children staged items, including the famous Koli Dance that was enacted for President



We thank the school for the opportunities and Jam session conducting after exams and during festivals celebration.


We thank the Cardinal for attending our Thanks giving day and felicitating the domestic staff and physically challenged students.




#### PERSONALITY COMPETITIONS






#### FELLOWSHIP MEAL




